Danielle Brander, MD, completed her medical degree, internal medicine residency, and hematology/oncology fellowship at Duke University. She continues there as faculty in the Division of Hematologic Malignancies & Cellular Therapy as well as at the Duke Cancer Institute.

Dr. Brander leads the Duke Chronic Lymphocytic Leukemia (CLL) and Indolent Lymphoma Clinic, where she serves as site primary investigator for all CLL clinical trials, many in collaboration with other academic CLL research centers. She is the team lead for both the Duke Lymphoma Clinical Research Working Group and the Duke B-cells Behaving Badly Research Working Group, and is dedicated to institutional and national educational initiatives.

Dr. Brander has participated nationally in both the American Society of Hematology (ASH) Clinical Research Training Program and the Lymphoma Research Foundation (LRF) Lymphoma Clinical Research Mentoring Program. Along with other members of the Duke CLL Research Team, Dr. Brander studies CLL biomarkers that could aid in predicting treatment-related toxicity and resistance, and could serve as future therapeutic targets. She hopes to continue to bring novel treatment approaches to her patients.

Dr. Brander has been honored for her research and teaching. She has received awards including the Silber Award for Most Outstanding Fellowship Research, the Elizabethtown College Apgar Distinguished Alumni Award, and the William Kane Hematology/Oncology Junior Faculty Teaching Award.




